CITY TO SAVE 40,000 GALLONS OF WATER A YEAR BY INSTALLING WATERLESS URINALS AT CITY FACILITIES

TUSTIN, Calif. –The City of Tustin will install thirty-three waterless urinals at City facilities. Each urinal will annually save approximately 40,000 gallons, totaling over 1.3 million gallons of water a year. The urinals are to be installed during the months of December and January.

In addition to saving water and reducing water bills, the waterless urinals cut down on odors, flush valve repairs and slush sensors, take advantage of low water pressure, dissuade vandalism, eliminate stoppages and overflows and reduce sewer waste.

The project was funded through a combination of general funds and a grant from the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California. Information on grants for homes and businesses is available at www.bewaterwise.com.

“Even with the recent rains, California continues to wrestle with persistent drought conditions. In addition to developing new water resources for the City of Tustin such as the new Pasadena Avenue Water Well, it is critical that we find ways to conserve as well,” said Acting Public Works Director Douglas Stack. “We have asked our community to conserve water and it is important that we do the same. Not only do we save a valuable natural resource, we save money as well, every bit helps.”
