## Course Overview

The *Tustin Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Basic Training Course* is a FEMA approved program that provides you with the basic skills to respond to family, neighborhood and community needs in the aftermath of a disaster, when emergency services may not be immediately available. When called upon by the City, CERT members can work together with first responders to support in saving lives and protecting property using the basic techniques taught in this course. Course instruction is provided by the Orange County Fire Authority and the Tustin Police Department. This course is currently offered twice per year (Spring and Fall).

## Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course, the participants should be able to:

1. Understand the types of hazards that are most likely to affect their homes, workplaces, and neighborhoods.
2. Take steps to prepare themselves and their families for a disaster.
3. Describe CERT organization and documentation requirements.
4. Understand the functions of a CERT and their response role.
5. Identify and reduce potential fire hazards in their homes, workplaces, and neighborhoods.
6. Work as a team to apply basic fire suppression strategies, resources, and safety measures to extinguish a pan fire.
7. Apply medical triage concepts during a major emergency or disaster.
8. Perform head-to-toe patient assessments.
9. Select and set up a treatment area.
10. Apply basic techniques for opening airways, controlling excessive bleeding, and treating for shock.
11. Employ basic treatments for various injuries and apply splints to suspected fractures and sprains.
12. Conduct planning and sizeup for light search and rescue situations.
13. Work as a team to apply safe techniques for debris removal and victim extrication.
14. Understand the post-disaster emotional environment and the steps that rescuers can take to relieve their own stress and those of disaster survivors.
